## Donation Overview: First Quarter Grants

One year after the storm, many survivors are still struggling to remove damaged trees and other yard debris that pose a threat to their newly-repaired homes.

In the first quarter of 2022, the Foundation has been able to focus on that need by awarding more than \$100,000 in long-term recovery grant funding to RiverLife, Plant Newnan, Foundation Church, and Newnan City Church, who are cooperating in the process of serving over 100 for this assistance.





During this grant cycle, the Foundation was able to award \$121,000 in total, with the remainder of funds awarded to Newnan-Coweta Habitat for Humanity for the purpose of case management allocations and structure repair.

The Foundation is currently accepting Letters of Intent for its 2nd quarterly long-term recovery grant cycle. The deadline to declare intent for this cycle is Friday, April 15.



## Breakdown of Donations for Tornado Disaster Relief

April 2021 - March 2022

Since the March 26th tornado, individuals and organizations in our community, and from around our state and nation, have responded with help for local Coweta citizens as they seek relief and recovery from this disaster. Local volunteers, churches, governments and charitable agencies have worked hard to carry out the needed response. The Coweta Community Foundation and its partners are proud to be a part of these efforts.



Since March 30th, CCF has received approximately \$605,000 for the purposes of Tornado Disaster Relief and Recovery from individual donors, and \$1.5 million from the June 26 "Where I Come From" concert. Over the last 12 months, the Foundation has distributed more than \$846,000 from 4 separate Funds: Plant Newnan Donor Advised, Newnan High School Students Truist Donor Advised Fund, Health & Human Services (Individual Donations) and the "Where I Come From" Alan Jackson Benefit Concert
