Donation Overview: First Quarter Grants

One year after the storm, many survivors are still struggling to remove damaged trees and other yard debris that pose a threat to their newly-repaired homes.

In the first quarter of 2022, the Foundation has been able to focus on that need by awarding more than \$95,000 in long-term recovery grant funding to RiverLife, Plant Newnan, Foundation Church, and Newnan City Church, who are cooperating in the process of serving over 75 households for this assistance.



During this grant cycle, the Foundation was able to award \$121,000 in total, with the remainder of funds awarded to Newnan-Coweta Habitat for Humanity for the purpose of case management allocations and structure repair.

The Foundation is will accept Letters of Intent for its 3rd quarterly long-term recovery grant cycle. The deadline to declare intent for this cycle is July 15.
